The Museum of Cambridge is the city's only museum that shares the stories and lives of the people of Cambridge. On the corner of Castle and Northampton Street in a 17th-century coaching inn, we share what life was and still is like living in Cambridge and the surrounding Fens. Our collection represents 300 years of stories about the everyday life, fears, hopes and experiences of the people in this area. We are proud to be an independent museum which is supported by a thriving team of volunteers across many areas of work.

The Museum is open 6 days a week, Wednesday- Monday. Saturday and weekdays 10-5pm and Sundays and Bank Holidays 11-4pm.
