

Legacies of Windrush Information Sheet

Introduction: The Legacies of Windrush in Cambridgeshire is a community-curated project, including an exhibition and public program, which presents a unique opportunity to honour and celebrate the contributions of the Windrush generation while fostering dialogue with the community. Beginning with a series of workshops on oral history, storytelling, and the experiences of the Windrush running throughout the summer, the project culminates in an exhibition at the museum opening in October, supported by a number of talks in the winter.

Objectives and Aims:

- Share stories of the Windrush generation through our exhibition.
- Foster dialogue between the older generation and younger people to ensure stories don't fade away.
- Train participants in oral histories, curation, and storytelling.
- Provide the local community an opportunity to have a say in what we share and display.

Intergenerational Approach:

Most elder participants for workshops will be partnered with a young person. This allows for the stories to be told in a traditional way, generation to generation, handing information down within the family. It will help to give a homely and familiar feel to the work, and each session will feel like the coming together of family.

Involvement: We are looking for anyone with a lived experience of Cambridgeshire and connection to the Windrush generation. Preferably family pairs (eg Grandparent and Grandchild but some solo participants can be accommodated)
